MORE FISH ARE TAKEN

Conditions on the Skeena Improving But Far From Good Pack Expected.

Fishing improved a little toward the week end on the Skeena River, boats getting an average of about 30 fish each, owing to the bad weather last week a number of fishermen did not go out every day but better conditions are expected during the remainder of the run. The pack this year is bound to be small however. Inverness pack to date is 4,300 cases but most of the other canneries have not put up that many.

Cohoos are coming pretty steadily now and some fairly good catches are reported at Dundas Island. Unless there is a big run of cohoos the fish run this year is likely to be far below the average and this seems to be about what the canners want owing to the glut of the market. In Alaska the market is much worse than it is here, with the result that salmon are being brought here from Alaskan waters and sold to local canners.

Reports from some of the canneries indicate that a number of the fishermen are in debt for outfit and maintenance to the cannery stores and that unless there is a marked change in the next week or two they will finish the season in debt.

FARMER FROM TERRACE DIES

H. A. Aidous Expires on Street While on Way From Train to Hospital.

The death occurred at 8:35 last evening of Henry Edelbert Aidous, a Terrace farmer, a few minutes after he had alighted from the passenger train on which he had arrived in the city to enter the General Hospital.

There was a large crowd of people coming up town from the train when Mr. Aidous was seen to collapse on the approach leading to Second Avenue. He was bleeding profusely from a hemorrhage of the lungs and death came very shortly after he fell. Sergeant McClintock, Constable McMeekin and Dr. J. P. Cade were quickly on the scene but nothing could be done.

The body was removed to the B. C. Undertaker's parlors and was shipped to Terrace on this morning's train accompanied by D. F. Robinson, of Terrace, and Miss Beatrice White, of the local hospital staff, who is a niece of the deceased.

Mr. Aidous was 50 years of age and is survived by a widow at Terrace.
