OIL GUSHER

Argentina Enters Area of Production With Finding of Well.

BUENOS AIRES, April 25.—The first big gusher among the oil wells in the government field at Comodoro Rivadavia has just been brought in with an estimated product of 25,000 barrels a day. The previous wells in that district had been small. As this new one is in a new part of the field it is thought that this may mean Argentina is entering on an era of large production. The oil is heavy, as is the other oil so far produced at Comodoro Rivadavia, and is of little use except for fuel.

GIANT AIRSHIP IS COMING FROM ITALY

ROME, April 27.—It is expected that the Roma, the giant airship purchased in Italy for the United States, will be delivered in America about the first fortnight in June.

The Roma is being dismantled at the Ciampino hangar with all possible speed and will be shipped to the United States soon after this work is completed the middle of May.
