Announcement Was Made Last Night by Roi Barnes at the Great War Veterans' Smoker.

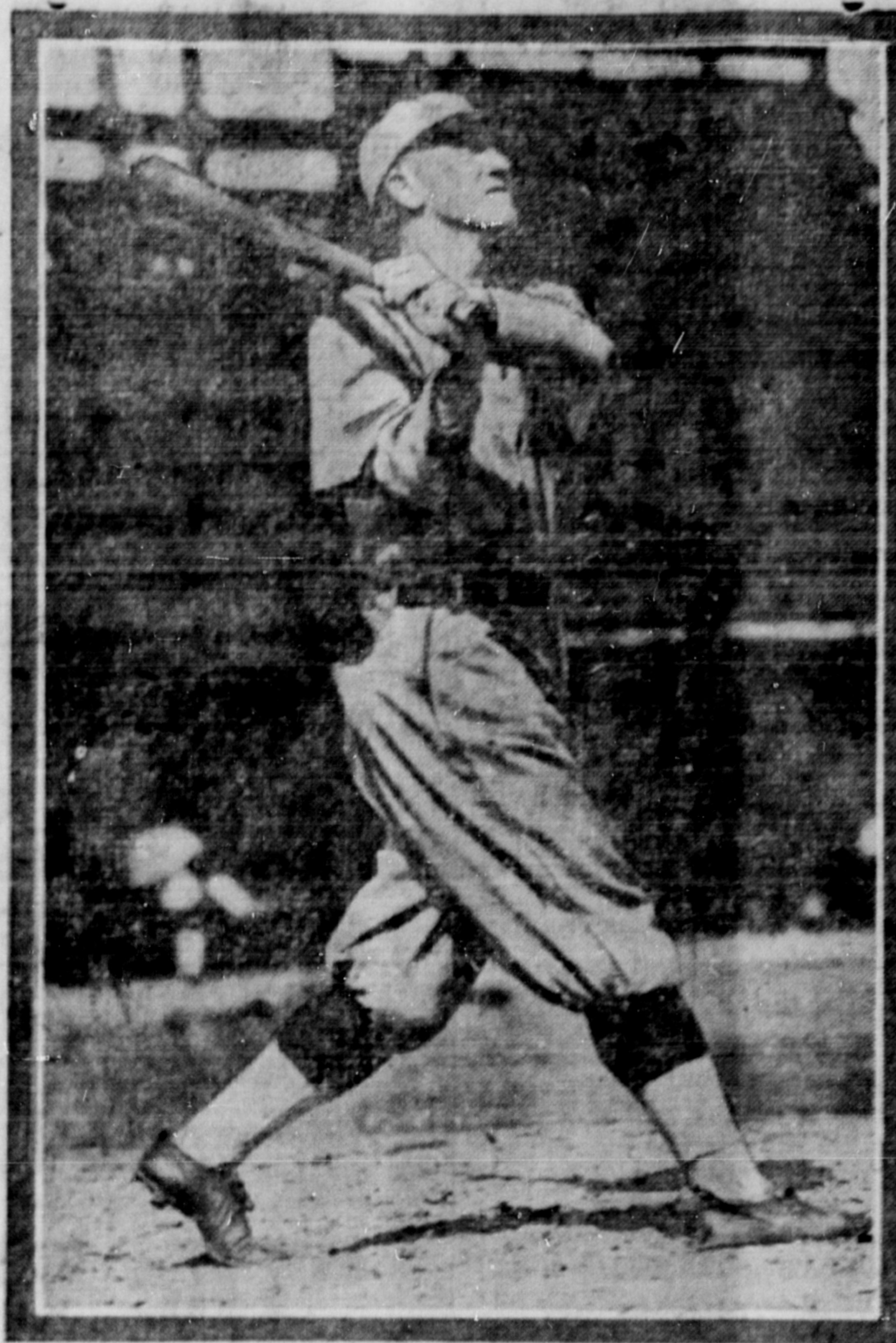

Chet Neff, the little boxer who was backed by several local sportsmen, has written to Roi Barnes that he is boxing at Mexicalo, New Mexico. There is nothing new in regard to his proposed return to Prince Rupert.

If his police duties would spare him the time, Prince Rupert boxing enthusiasts might have the opportunity of seeing an exhibition of heavyweight boxing if Constable Sharpe of Swanson Bay, the amateur heavyweight champion of B. C., could be induced to enter a contest and a match could be found for him. There have been few heavyweights seen in action here and such a match under proper auspices would be a pleasant diversion from the usual line of lightweights goes that have been put on here.

While Jack Dempsey is regarded as the most likely winner in the battle which is to be staged on July 2 between himself and Carpenter, the latter seems to be steadily gaining popularity and supporters of Dempsey seem to be finding little difficulty in getting Carpenter money. As far as personal favor is concerned Carpenter seems to have it all his own way but the balance of opinion is that he is going to have a hard time to defeat the American. Dempsey is the heavier of the two and the hardest hitter but on the other hand Carpenter is the speedier and a marvel with defensive tactics, and he will not miss any openings.

SALT LAKES WALK BEING COMPLETED

Work Well Under Way and Will Be Finished in Time for the Opening of Swimming Season.

J. A. Murray and three other men are working on the extension of the new walk connecting the landing with the Salt Lake swimming pool. Last year part of this was built by the Provincial Government but when about half completed the money was found to have been all expended. Now the work is again well under way and the walk will be ready by the time the swimming season opens. The new route follows the water and is much more picturesque than the former one.
