Peace with Ireland Arranged in Conference Between Sinn Fein and British Government

LONDON, Dec. 6.—It is officially announced that an agree- CHANCE GIVEN on Fein which it is expected will finally settle the Irish difficulty ensure lasting peace between the two countries. The terms the agreement will be submitted to the British Parliament and undoubtedly meet with ready acceptance. It will also be emitted to the Dail Eireann at Dublin, and acceptance there is confidently accepted. A copy of the agreement has also been et to the Ulster Government.

Sinn Fein delegates were in session until 11 o'clock last occasionally telephoning Downing Street in connection difficulties that arose. At 11:15 the British ministers called meeting with Sinn Fein, which lasted until 2:30 o'clock this wring, and the delegates then retired home exhausted, stating an agreement had been reached.

PARTICULARS OF THE AGREEMENT.

The agreement reached early this morning by the British and deferred payments only remain m Fein representatives binds both sides to recommend it to respective parliaments. It is a formal, detailed and conain document, and the terms prevent the necessity for ther negotiations.
