LOVE LETTERS USED IN BETTY COMPSON PHOTOPLAY TONIGHT

Violinist Gives Change of Program Tonight during Interval Between Shows.

If you write love letters to a girl, always date your letters. Otherwise, they may serve a purpose that is inspired by anything but love. This is the moral gained from the experience of Julian Rolfe, played by William T. Carleton in "The Law and the Woman," a new Paramount picture starring Betty Compson, at the Westholme Theatre tonight. In this screen adaptation of Clyde Fitch's play, Mr. Carleton plays the role of the husband who is accused of the murder of his young ward, who has just been married to an unscrupulous woman with whom Rolfe had been infatuated some years before.
