HELL WILL BE ON THE EARTH

Evangelist McAllister Advances Scientific and Scriptural Proof For His Beliefs

The speaker preached a powerful sermon in support of his theory that there really was a Hell. The Word of God, he declared, proved this and there were also scientific reasons for the belief. It was well known that 20 miles below the surface of the earth there was continuous fire. Scientists claimed that this fire was gradually working its way outward with the result that volcanoes and other eruptions were becoming more frequent. They claimed that in 1,000 years the earth would be a blazing and molten sphere covered with fire. Evangelist McAllister declared that, then, the saints would be taken away through the air to their reward while the sinners would remain on earth to suffer in the Hell that would then have been created. The fact that there was a Hell was proven in the Scriptures by the destruction of the earth by water in the days of Noah and the subsequent destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah.

There were services both in the afternoon and evening. Evangelist McAllister's subject in the afternoon being "The Baptism of the Holy Ghost." Chas. Miller sang a solo in the afternoon and Mrs. Isaac Lear in the evening.
