The movement, initiated during the winter months and which the Prince Rupert delegates to Ottawa fostered on their recent trip to the capital, to get the cabinet ministers and Eastern members of parliament to visit the West and the ports of the Pacific Coast is gaining strength and momentum. One after another of the western boards of trades are getting behind the idea. For it is an idea. It is something more than propaganda on behalf of the West for it is based on the sincere conviction that the very best way to remove fancied causes of friction between the East and the West, and between certain sections of the West and East even, and to promote a better understanding is to show Eastern parliamentarians just what the West is, to give them insight on the spot of its varied resources, its geographical features and peculiarities, and to meet and talk over in the frank western way the special problems of East and West alike.

Western people travel East frequently as a pleasure and on business. They feel it is a duty they owe themselves. But relatively few Eastern folk, unless they represent commercial houses. or are seeking land, make the long trip West. Professional and business men of Toronto, Montreal or the Maritime Provinces rarely find time to see Western Canada and this is particularly truetof Eastern members of parliament. It is to be hoped that the members coming West this year will include those from Quebec and the Atlantic seaboard as well as from old Ontario.

It is particularly important from a law making standpoint that the ministers and eastern members should come West. Many of them have never seen this country but are, nevertheless, instrumental in making laws governing it. While, doubtless, they have studied the West their knowledge of it, if they have not actually seen it, can be nothing else than detached and super-2 minumenter ficial. The Oriental question is a case in point illustrative of this condition. The mere fact that all thirteen members for B.C. voted for an exclusive measure a few days ago and forgot political affiliation in doing so indicates that their intimacy with conditions had formed their strong conviction as to the menace. If Eastern members came here and saw the conditions at first hand there is every likelihood that many of them might change their
