INDIGENT INDIANS ARE NOT WANTED IN GENERAL HOSPITAL

Indians in future will not be admitted to the Prince Rupert General Hospital except on the order of the Indian agent or if they pay in advance a sum covering two weeks' treatment. A report to the board last night from the finance committee to this effect was adopted, it being pointed out that in view of the fact that the Dominion government conducted an Indian hospital at Port Essington there was no necessity for natives being treated here at the city's expense.

Dr. J. P. Cade pointed out that there might be difficulty in carrying such a rule out when Indians fell sick or were injured in the city.

The medical profession is to be asked to co-operate with the hospital board in having the rule strictly adhered to.
