AMERICAN CABARET IS INVADING LONDON
Several Opened There And Are Becoming Popular
LONDON, Oct. 18.—Determined efforts are being made to domicile here the cabaret entertainment, which enters so largely into the life of Continental and American cities. There are now three such entertainments in the West End. At the Hotel Metro-pole the "Midnight Follies" have been appearing for a long time past, though their performances are restricted by the L.C.C. regulations, and two other entertainments have been recently started. One of these is at the Queen's Hall, and is called the "Cabaret Follies," and the other is at Murray's Dancing Club. The first performance at Murray's was ambitious. The program takes place while the audience is at dinner or supper, and during each part of it there are eight turns. At the Queen's Hall Roof the "Cabaret Follies" present a large chorus, and here also there are two performances each night—one at dinner and one at supper. These cabarets are a new feature of London life, and one that is likely to become quickly more popular. At present they are to a certain extent hampered by the early hour at which travel ceases, but nevertheless they are largely attended, especially by those who are in London on holiday.
