SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENTS

Minimum price of first-class and reduced to \$5 an acre, second-class to \$2.50 an acre.

Pre-emption now confined to surface.

Records will be granted covering any land suitable for agricultural purposes and which is non-timber land.

Partnership pre-emption.

Parties to a partnership may make arrangements for adjacent pre-emption with joint residents, but each making necessary improvements on respective claims.

Pre-emptors must occupy claims for five years and make improvements to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivation of at least 5 acres before receiving Crown Grant.

Landowner in possession more than 5 years and has made no proportionate improvements, he may be cause of ill-health, or other cause, be granted a term of 10 years, and if unoccupied and transferred his claim ends.

Records without permanent residence may be issued, provided applicant makes improvements to extent of 200 per cent and retains same for 5 years. Failure to make improvements or record same will operate as forfeiture. Title cannot be obtained in less than 5 years, and improvements of \$10 per acre are required.

Recorded areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesites, to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions.

For grazing and industrial purposes areas up to 400 acres may be granted by one person or company.

Mill, factory or industrial sites on timber land not exceeding 40 acres, may be purchased conditions include payment of stampage.

Natural, not meadows, inaccessible existing roads may be purchased conditional upon construction of a road thereon. Rate of one-half of cost of road, not exceeding half of purchase price, is made.

Pre-emptor's free grants act.

The scope of this act is enlarged to include all persons joining and serving with His Majesty's Forces. The one with which the heirs or devisees of deceased pre-emptor may and for title under the Act is extended from one year to the death of such person, as formerly, until one year after the conclusion of the great war. This privilege is also made retroactive.

No fees relating to pre-emption are due or payable by soldiers on pre-empted lands after April 28, 1918. Fees are remitted for five years.

Provision for return of money accrued, due and been paid since August 1, 1914, on account of payments, fees or taxes on grants or pre-exceptions.
