## ANTONIO ROSAS AGED 132, STILL EARNS HIS OWN LIVING

BUENOS AIRES, May 4.—Antonio Rosas, a negro who is reported to have been born 132 years ago in the African Congo, is still earning a living in Buenos Aires as a medicine man and ticket seller. He was too old to put up a fight when three men held him up and robbed him a few days ago but told a reporter he would have made a better showing if he had not "taken a drop too much." Antonio does not yet believe in prohibition.

Antonio claims to have been captured in the Congo when a child by French slave traders. The French ship on which he and other negroes were placed was pursued and captured by an English vessel and taken to Madeira. He was brought to Argentina at the age of eight.

He saw the birth of the Argentine nation in 1810 and slavery abolished in 1813. In later years he adopted the surname of Rosas after the famous Argentine tyrant, Rosas, of whom he was an admirer. He is one of the few negroes living in Buenos Aires.

## LOOKING FOR SON SENTENCED TO HANG

WINNIPEG, May 3.—Missing for more than 20 years, the Salvation Army has been asked to help in the hunt for Will Purvis, son of Mrs. M. J. Purvis of this city. According to Mrs. Purvis her son was tried and convicted for the murder of a farmer near Columbia, Mississippi, but the gallows refused to work when his execution was to take place. Later a farmer on his death-bed confessed to the crime, entirely exonerating Purvis, who afterward was awarded \$5,000 compensation by the Mississippi legislature for his wrongful conviction and imprisonment.

## GOLD AND PLATINUM ORE SHOWING HIGH VALUES LETHBRIDGE

LETHBRIDGE, Alta., May 4.—Gold and platinum bearing ore, showing a high percentage, have been taken from the West Butte Sweet Grass Hills, southeast of this city and following closely on the assay reports from Montreal, negotiations were opened with the old country capital to interest them in developing the property. Three lots of samples sent to Montreal show, Class 1, gold \$493 per ton; Class 2, gold \$250 per ton; Class 3, gold, \$82 per ton. Platinum averaged one and one half percent.

## NOT MUCH DOING AT FORT NORMAN DURING WINTER

EDMONTON, May 4.—No

startling developments were recorded at Fort Norman during the winter, according to Ronald McKinnon, of the Imperial Oil Company's staff, who recently arrived here from the northern oil fields. Little work, it is said was accomplished by the men left at the oil drills owing to the extreme weather and solidly frozen ground. There is no change in the condition of the discovery well—oil exists in the drilling, but the well cannot be classified as a gusher.

Mr. McKinnon left Norman late in January and travelled the entire 1200 miles to Fort McMurray by dog team, relays of fresh dogs being secured at each post.
