Plenty of Interesting Roles in Picture "One Clear Call" at Westholme

A romance of the south, colored with pathos and humor and sprinkled with mystery, furnishes the basic story thread in the new John M. 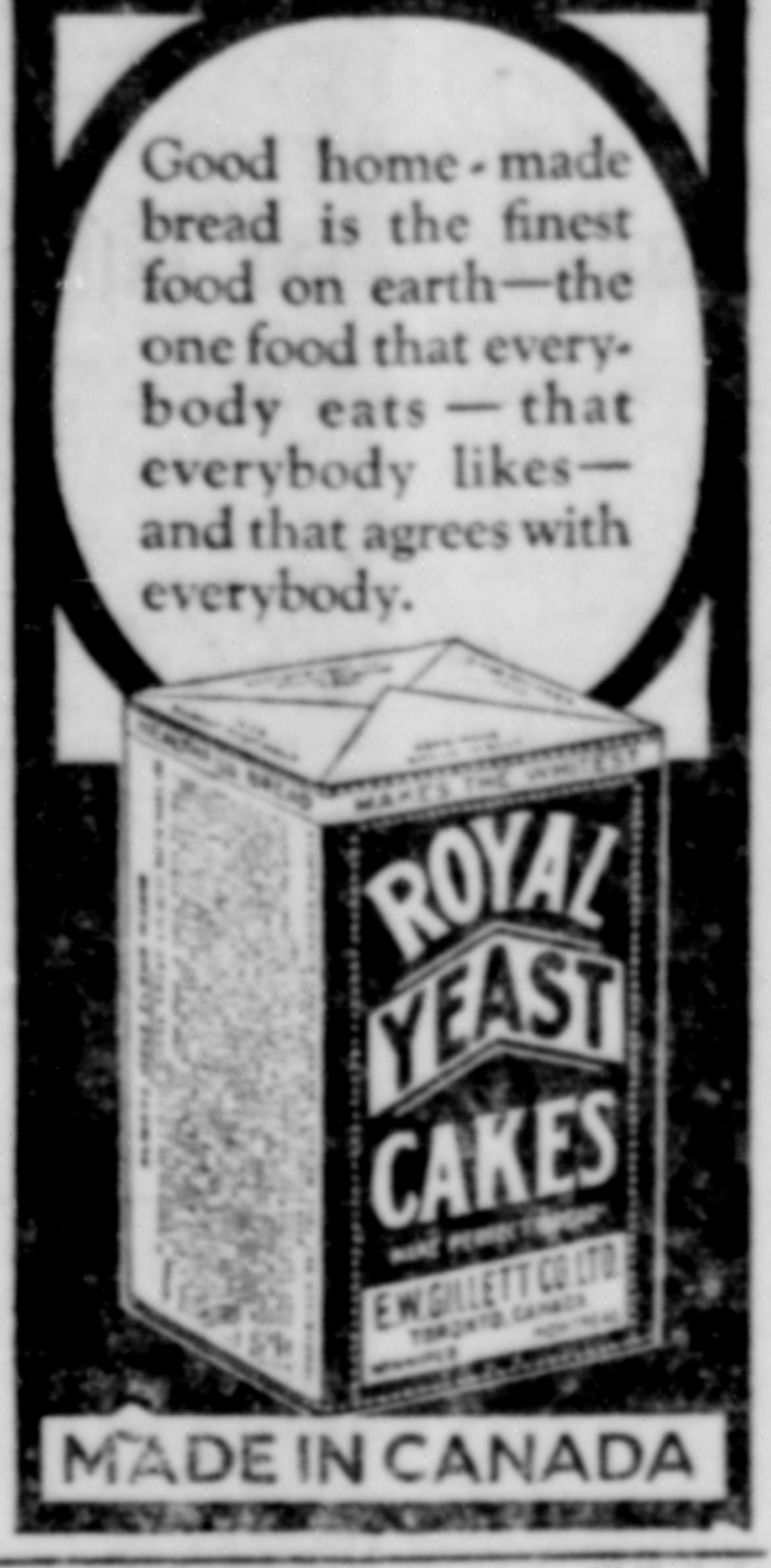
"Blackie" Bittell, formerly of Alice Arm but now located at Hyder, is suffering from a stroke of paralysis on the side of the face.
