The report of the board of works regarding the pipe line from the Hays Creek dam was laid over for a week by the city council last night.

A letter from ex-Alderman Hamilton Douglas, protesting the erection of the city incinerator on Third Avenue East as being detrimental to the residents of Fourth Avenue East, was received and filed by the city council last night.

J. A. Kirkpatrick has offered to sell his equity in lot 1, block 21a, "Section 1," to the city for \$2000 in city bonds. The communication to this effect, read at last night's council meeting, was referred to the Finance Committee.

The bylaw, brought in to the city council by Ald. Gollart and Ald. Kelly, regulating the location of pizzerias, washhouses, laundries, stables, hen-houses, cow-barns, etc., was laid over for a week by the city council last night.

The city council last night granted permission to the provincial government to use the street roller on the level crossing roadway at Cow Bay providing the cost of operating it on the work was paid for by the government.

Suit has been entered in the Supreme Court by Clifford Angus, 1035 Davie Street, against F. Avazoff, 1108 Nicola street, claiming unstated damages for the death of Catherine Angus, who it is alleged was killed by the negligent driving of Avazoff.

Rose, Gowan & Latta, printers, were awarded the contract for the preparing of 1000 delinquent tax notices, in triplicate, perforated and in book form, by the council last night, the bid being \$58.50. A. O. Franks' tender was \$64.25 and McRae Bros., \$60.

The case of O. W. Gray vs. John Dahlberg, involving a sum of money loaned, has been set for hearing in the County Court at 10:30 tomorrow morning before Judge Young. Williams, Manson & Gonzales have the case for the plaintiff and Patmore & Fulton for the defence. Both parties in the action are residents of Alice Arm.



Conversation, the act of talking together, holds a place in life the importance of which, it would seem, is hardly realized. We hear much these days of the art of public speaking, and we are urged to learn how to address gatherings with ease, fluency and clarity, but how often is the desirability of developing the same skill in carrying on conversation ever brought to our attention?

Conversation is more important than written communication, is it not? And certainly it is only comparatively few of the people who make speeches, but everyone of us carries on conversation. What characteristics mark the good conversationalist? In considering this question let us omit mention of business talks and deal solely with conversation apart from that phase.

Conversation gives entertainment, can be informative, and can be an important factor in mind development. The good conversationalist seeks to find out in what the other person is interested. He is willing to allow the other a liberal portion of the talking, is anxious to get his opinions and information but at the same time realizes that to be a good listener is not everything for in expressing his own views an individual clarifies his thoughts, creates thoughts and develops mentally. The conversation, therefore, under normal circumstances, should be fairly shared so that the fullest benefit may be secured. The good conversationalist is accurate in statement, does not exaggerate, and does not dogmatize. He has a good command of English but does not use words which the others would not understand.

Conversation does not hold its rightful place in our social life. Do people, generally speaking, show any great desire these days to spend an evening in conversation? Are they not too prone to choose the theatre, the dance, billiards, cards, or other forms of entertainment? If you have at times sat before a blazing fire and, with a kindred soul, ranged over a great variety of subjects in conversation you will probably agree that this method of spending the hours of an evening is a delightful one.
