CONSTANTINOPLE, Sept. 29. — Brig.-Gen. Harrington, EVERYBODY HAPPY commander of the British forces at the Dardanelles, plans to leave today for a conference with Mustapha Kemal at Mudania. The British are confident that if the next 24 hours passes without the firing of shots at Chanak or elsewhere along the Dardanelles, the immediate danger of hostilities will be avoided. This is the time estimated for General Harrington's journey and interview.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Sept. 29 (p.m.) - Turk Nationalists occupied the whole of the neutral zone on the Asiatic side of the Dardanelles with the exception of the Chanak area where the British are entrenched.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Sept. 29. Mustapha Kemal, replying to General Harrington's message declares his troops would not advance further. He says he desires no incidents should occur and he will see General Harrington as soon as possible.

The decision was a complete victory for Mrs. Stillman. Not only was her defence upheld but the referee confirms the charges that Stillman misconducted himself with Florence Leeds, a show girl, and Mrs. Leeds had borne two children.

History of Case.

The divorce case, in which the principals accused one another of being the parents of illegitimale children, has been in many ways without parallel in the history of domestic ruptures in American high society.

James A. Stillman, who instituted the court proceedings, was president of the National City Bank of New York, the son of a former head of that institution and a noted multi-millionaire. Premier Mine Pays Another Dividend to Shareholders Making Total of \$2,4000,000

VANCOUVER, Sept. 29 .- The Premier Gold Mine Company has declared a dividend of fifteen per cent, amounting to \$750,-000 for distribution at the end of this month. The capitalization Immense Sums Spent in Securing of the mine is five million dollars.

This dividend makes the fourth distribution since the tramway commenced operating on December 20 last, the total distribution reaching the amazing total of \$2,400,000, or a return James Stillman, former president to the shareholders of almost half their investment in nine months. This is believed to be a record for any mine or company in existence.

The Premier Mine is controlled by the American Smelting and Refining Co. operating the smelter at Tacoma. The dividends are paid from the proceeds of the profit on the mine and the smelting company makes further profits from the smelting. The mine has been turning out ore valued at \$400,000 monthly.
