Can Genoa Conference Be Successful?

Hope for the ultimate success of the Genoa economic conference in bringing about a basis for the settlement of Europe's many problems of reconstruction and reorganization has been gradually giving way until concrete results now seem to be definitely despaired of. The two extreme points of difference are, on the one hand, Russia and Germany, and on the other, France. Their positions at the present time are so far divided and their aims and ideals so remotely different that hope of any reconciliation between them now seems to be almost an impossibility. And can it be expected otherwise? France is constitutionally very different than Russia and the aims and principles of the Soviet AAT government hear little similarity to those of the French government which, though republican, is still conservative. As far as Germany and France are concerned there is such inherent and traditional distrust between the two nations that their amicable agreement can only be brought about with difficulty.

Great Britain As Mediator.

The course taken by Great Britain and Italy, the other two big factors in the parley, have been of a mediative nature. They seem to exhibit a certain attitude of "give and take."
