FRIENDS FOR A SHORT TIME.

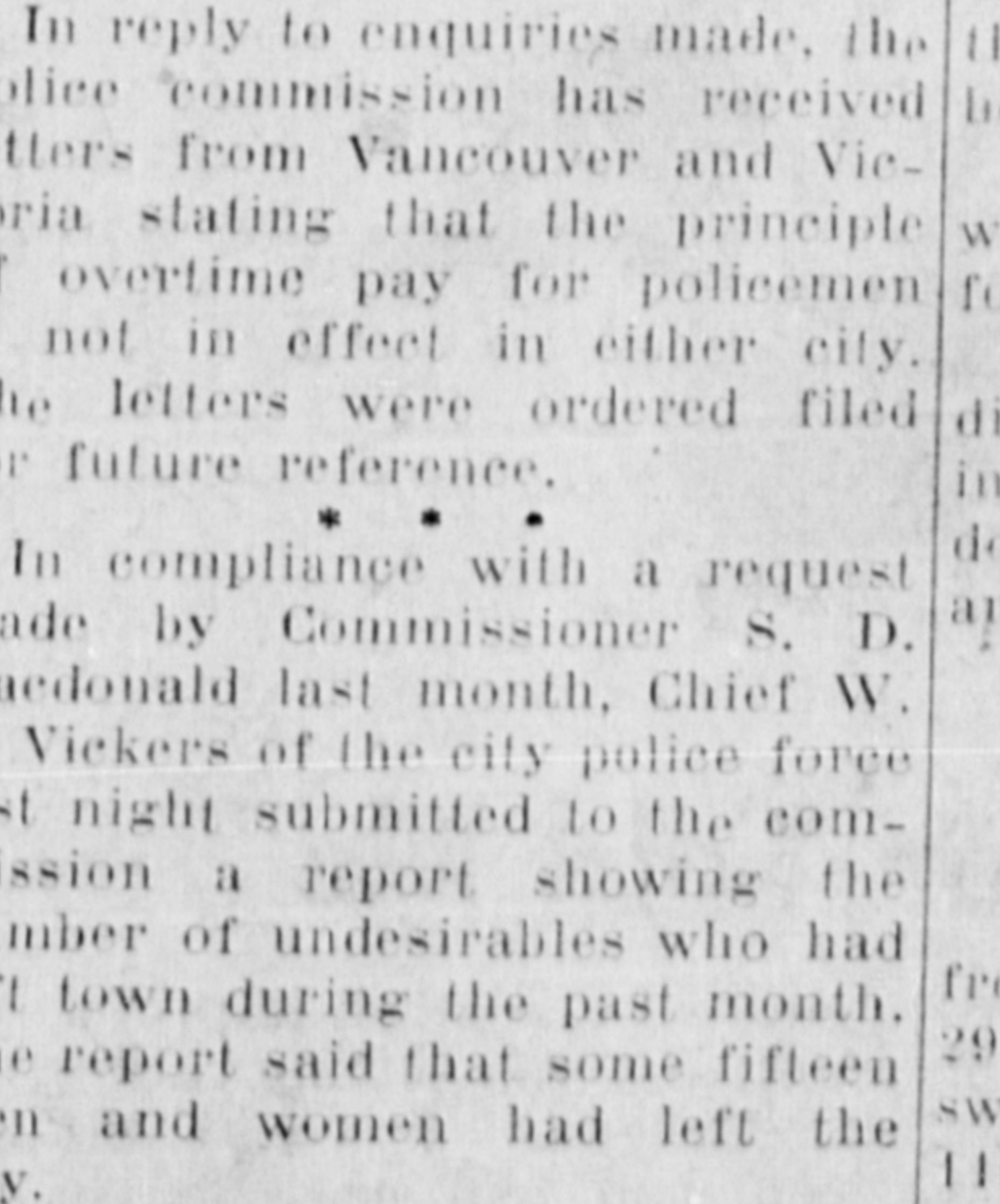
