

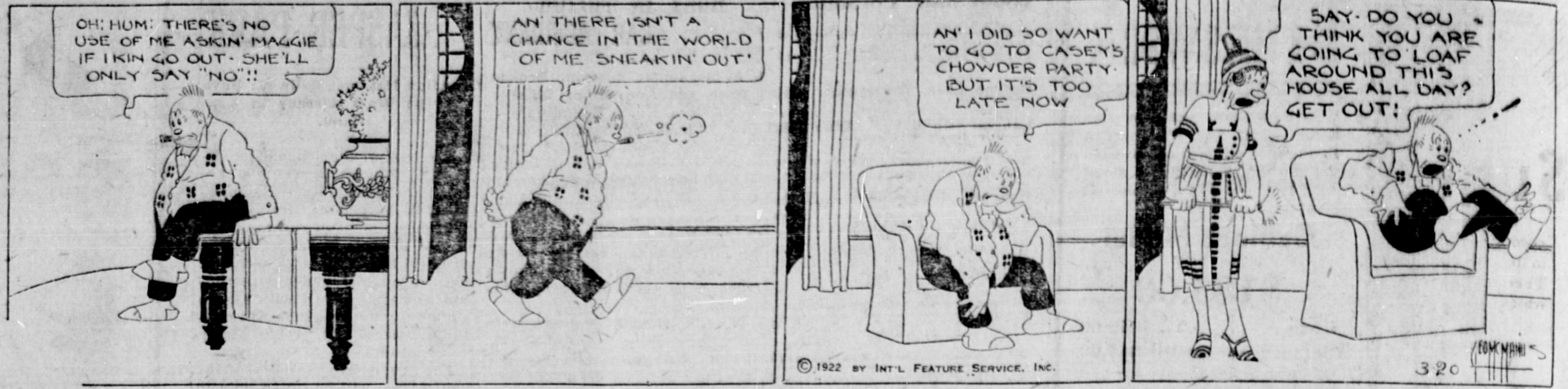

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CHURCH MAKES AN APPEAL TO SAVE CHILDREN

Millions Dying in Russia But Many May Yet Be Kept Alive.

LETTER READ YESTERDAY.

At the Anglican Church yesterday Rev. Canon Rix read a pastoral letter from the Primate of Canada making an appeal on behalf of the children of Russia who are dying of famine. The appeal says in part:

Today I make my appeal to you on behalf of the sufferers from a calamity which exceeds, in its horror all known examples of similar afflictions. Of this truly colossal calamity a recent observer, Dr. Hansen, after careful survey reports, and his report has been confirmed by a direct representative of the Dominion Government:

"I venture to say that it is beyond question the most appalling famine that has ever happened in the recorded history of man. There have been great famines in the poorer parts of India and China, but this is a famine in the most prosperous of the grain providing areas of Europe. And now that it has come it is incomparably worse, even than I had feared. It is worse because the region is inhabited not, as I believed, by 15 million, but by 33 million people, of whom at least 19 million are directly or seriously menaced with death, and of whom millions are inevitably doomed to die whatever we may now do, because it is too late to help them all."

Drought, unprecedented in its severity, extended last year over the great wheat-growing regions along the Volga River; a densely populated area about equal in length to the distance from Toronto to Winnipeg, and five hundred miles, or more, wide. In this whole area scarcely a single kernel of the wheat sown appeared above the ground.

This Year and Next.
Dr. Nansen adds: "There have been droughts before in Russia; but there has never been a drought in the memory of man such as that which smote the plains of Russia in 1921. Such a vast economic disaster would have shaken the strongest state to its foundations."

JERUSALEM NOT YET HAPPY HOME SITE

Northcliffe Was Shocked at Having to Be Guarded by Armored Cars.

LONDON, March 27.—Lord Northcliffe, British newspaper publisher, expressed surprise on his visit to Jerusalem that it was deemed necessary to meet him and escort him through the streets with armored cars. He said it was a source of wonder to him how little the people in England and America knew about the conditions existing in the Holy Land.

Voicing regret that he found Palestine so unhappy, he asserted that the British public "was imperfectly informed regarding the feeling in Palestine" and he added that he hoped Palestinians would not move too quickly and make Palestine "another Ireland."

Lord Northcliffe was given an opportunity to hear two sides of the Zionist question. A delegation of Orthodox Jews which waited on him protested against Zionism. Later a deputation of Zionists called and requested an expression from him on the Balfour declaration of Great Britain's intention to make this a Jewish homeland. To this latter delegation, the British publisher said:

"No one wishes the Jew, to return to the Holy Land more than I do but I have the greatest regret of the need of armored cars. You exaggerate the idea that the only topic we have in England is Zion. Every one does not agree as yet on the interpretation of the Balfour declaration.

He reminded the Zionists that Orthodox Jewry did not concur in the political aims of Zionism as indicated by the delegation from that faction which had previously called upon him.

Concluding, Lord Northcliffe expressed the hope that Arabs and Jews would be more reasonable in their demands upon England and work together for the good of Palestine.

PRINCE OF WALES WILL SPEND MONTH VISITING IN JAPAN

Leaves That Country on May 8 for Philippine Islands.

LONDON, March 27.—The Prince of Wales is to spend nearly a month in Japan and numerous dinner parties, balls and other ceremonies and entertainments have been arranged in his honor.

The program of his stay in the Mikado's Empire, as announced here, shows that after arriving in Yokohama on the battleship Renown, April 12, he will go straight to Tokio where he will be entertained with dinners at the Japanese foreign office and at the Prime Minister's official residence. The British Embassy in Tokio and the British colony in Yokohama are planning to give balls to celebrate his visit. After a week in those two cities, the Prince will go to Nikko for two days and afterwards will visit Odawara and Lake Hakone, visiting Yokohama on the way to unveil the inter-Allied war memorial arch which has been erected by popular subscription on the "Bluff," the foreign residential district.

Later, he will proceed by automobile to Shoji, where he will remain over night and on the following day will go to Iida where he will descend the Tenryugawa rapids as far as the railway line where he will take the train for Kioto. One week

SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENTS

Minimum price of first-class and reduced to \$5 an acre; second-class to \$2.50 an acre.

Pre-emption now confined to surveyed lands only.

Records will be granted covering any land suitable for agricultural purposes and which is non-timber land.

Partnership pre-emption abolished, but parties of not more than four may arrange to make improvements in common with joint residence, but each making necessary improvements on respective claims.

Pre-emptors must occupy claims for five years and make improvements to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivation of at least 5% before receiving Crown Grant.

Where pre-emption is made in less than 3 years and has made any portion improvements, he may be cause of ill-health, or other cause, be granted intermediate certificate of improvement and transfer his claim.

Records without permanent residence may be purchased, provided applicant makes improvements to extent of \$50 per annum and records same each year. Failure to make improvements or record same will operate as to forfeiture. Title cannot be obtained in less than 5 years after commencement of improvements.

Pre-emptor holding Crown Grant may record another pre-emption, if he requires land in conjunction with his present actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted land.

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesteads, title to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions.

For grazing and industrial purposes areas exceeding 640 acres may be leased by one person or company. Mill, factory or industrial sites on timber land not exceeding 40 acres may be purchased, conditions include payment of stumpage.

Natural hay meadows inaccessible by existing roads may be purchased conditional upon construction of a road to them. Rebate of one-half of cost of road, not exceeding half of purchase price, is made.

PRE-EMPTORS' FREE GRANTS ACT.

The scope of this Act is enlarged to include all persons joining and serving with His Majesty's Forces. The time within which the heirs or devisees of a deceased pre-emptor may apply for a pre-emption is extended from one year from the death of such person, as formerly, until one year after the conclusion of the great war. This privilege is also made retrospective.

No fees relating to pre-emptions are due or payable by soldiers on pre-emptions recorded after Nov. 26, 1918. Taxes are remitted for five years.

Provision for return of moneys accrued, due and been paid since August 4, 1914, on account of payments, fees or taxes on holdings, acreage, cleared town or city lots held by members of Allied Forces, or Associates, acquired direct or indirect, permitted from enlistment to March 31, 1920.

SUB-PURCHASERS OF CROWN LANDS

Provision made for issuance of Crown grants to sub-purchasers of Crown Lands, acquiring rights from purchasers who failed to complete purchase, involving forfeiture, on fulfillment of conditions of purchase, interest and taxes. Where sub-purchasers do not claim whole of original parcel, purchase price plus and taxes may be distributed proportionately over whole area. Applications must be made by May 1, 1929.

GRAZING

Grazing Act, 1915, for systematic development of livestock industry provides for grazing districts and range administration under Commissioner. Annual grazing permits issued based on numbers raised, priority for established owners. Stock-owners may form Associations for range management. Fees, or partially free, permits for settlers, campers or travellers up to ten head.
