Curious Shootings Worry New IRISH TURMOIL SEEMS TO BE ON INCREASE RATHER THAN ABATE

Street Shootings in New York Occurred Last Night and Early This Morning

NEW YORK, March 27 .- Street murders are causing quite a sensation here. Three men were shot to death at different parts of the city last night and early today and the city is all agog over the tragedies.

One man, according to the police account, was lured by a fashionably dressed young woman and shot down from a taxicab. Another was slain as he walked through a crowd of pedestrians at the corner of 110th Street and Fifth Avenue. The third was shot in Brooklyn Street.

The police do not yet know if there is any connection between these shootings, but they strongly suspect that they are related. Happening in the fashionable section of the city, they have attracted more attention than they otherwise would.
