FIRE ALARM SYSTEM EASY

Directions Not Followed Last Night When Attempt Failed.

Several minutes before the fire department reached the blaze at the Prince Rupert Music Store last evening, an unsuccessful attempt was made by a passer-by to ring in an alarm from the box at the corner of Third Avenue and Third Street. Apparently this person did not know the simple process of operating the signal with which it is the duty of every citizen, man, woman or child, to become familiar. The operation is a simple one and is clearly explained in the following directions which appear on the back cover of all the telephone books:

1. Break glass.
2. Turn brass key inside glass to right thus opening door.
3. Pull white knob inside box and let go.
4. Remain at box until arrival of fire brigade.

The glass may be readily broken with a small stone, pocket knife or any other object or with a shove of the elbow. The brass key only requires an eighth turn and the door will spring open. The white knob is then simply pulled down from the top to the bottom of the slot and the alarm is then completed. The person establishing the alarm should be on hand on the arrival of the department so that any necessary directions may be given.

Several persons have apparently been under the impression that the turning of the brass key is all that is necessary. This, however, is not the case, for the white knob must also be pulled down.
