The secretary to the Admiral of the Fleet reports that the fish arrivals this week have improved somewhat, the arrival of several of the large schooners having boosted the Fish Exchange returns.

Total Catch

The total amount of fish landed during the past week, up to and including yesterday, was 571,000 pounds as against 303,400 pounds landed last week, an increase of 267,600 pounds.

Haysport Ready

The power boat Haysport, owned by T. A. Goulson, which is under contract to the Rupert Marine Products Ltd., Tucks Inlet, for the securing of dogfish for that plant, is practically ready to commence fishing operations. This boat has undergone a complete overhaul, and will be ready for business not later than Monday next. The Haysport has been fitted with a special two barrel winch which will operate a 40 foot otter trawl. The machinery has been thoroughly remodelled and a new electric light engine has been installed. The machinery has been furnished and installed by the Rupert Marine Ironworks, Ltd. A new rudder stock has also been added. The P.R.T. owned by the Rupert Marine Products Ltd. will act as a tender to the Haysport and will accompany her with two 50 ton scows.

Predicted Storm

Notification was received by the Admiral of the Fleet from the local meteorological Digby Island wireless station on Tuesday night that the barometer was dropping very fast and predicting a heavy storm to break locally on Wednesday night. This timely information enabled the boys to make their boats extra secure and nautical sentries were placed at their station stations. While a strong south-easterly gale struck the waterfront on Wednesday night no damage was done. The waterfront boys are very appreciative of the timely co-operation of the wireless station.

Bluenose the Hero

The hero of the hour in Admiralty circles this week was the Canadian fishing schooner Bluenose, Capt. Walters, which defeated the U.S. schooner Henry Ford, Capt. Morrissey, in the third race for the sailing championship of the north Atlantic, by about a mile and a half at Gloucester, Mass., on Thursday. While it is generally agreed that it was hard luck for the Henry Ford to lose her topmast, the boys say it was all in the game and consider that it does not detract one iota from the splendid sailing qualities of the Bluenose and her competent skipper.

The Admiral is very keen on staging a similar race, of course on a smaller scale, for local fishing boats, on the lines laid down in a recent editorial of The Daily News. He considers there would be no difficulty in organizing such a race locally and that doubtless a few of our public spirited men would donate a cup or a suitable cash prize to be
