BETTER MAIL SERVICE FOR PEACE RIVER HAS BEEN INAUGURATED

EDMONTON, June 15.—An open mail car for the Edmonton, Dunvegan and British Columbia Railway commences operation today. For the past eight years if a letter was sent from any of the northern towns for transmission to the next locality it had to come to Edmonton before it could be redirected to its destination. Should the train run in ten hours or more late, as was often the case in the winter, as much as ten days would elapse between the mailing of a letter and its delivery. The facility has been authorized since November, 1921, but owing to lack of rolling stock the C. P. R. were not able to place it in service prior to this. It will operate as far as Spirit River for the present, but the citizens of Grande Prairie are agitating for an extension of the service to that town. At present Grande Prairie, Clairmont and Peace River take the bulk of the mail matter conveyed over the road.

POLITICAL CAMPAIGN MANITOBA FULL SWING

Government Still Conducting Affairs of Country Until Election is Held.

WINNIPEG, June 15.—While the Manitoba Government has not yet resigned office and is holding on at the special request of the Lieut-Governor supported by the opposition leaders, preparations are being made for a big contest and candidates are being nominated by all parties. The general wish seems to be that whatever may be the outcome of the contest, the party that gets a majority shall have it clear of all other parties so that they may feel themselves free to go ahead with necessary legislation without being held up at every turn.
