We particularly recommend this service, 7c per lb plus 1c per piece. Minimum charge \$1.50.

ROUGH DRY—This service returns everything dry—flat pieces ironed and folded and wearing apparel starched. This should appeal to those who wish to do as little laundry work as possible in the home and yet do not want to pay the high cost of finishing the entire bundle in the laundry. 9c per lb plus 1c per piece. Minimum charge \$1.25.

NOTE—The 1c per piece is to equalize the cost of handling numerous small pieces such as handkerchiefs, etc.
