**WEALTHY WOMEN ARE DUPED BY MAN WHO POSED AS A MYSTIC**

Dr. Tangier, Self-Styled Buddhist Priest, Leaves for Parts Unknown

WINNIPEG, June 20.—While the city and Dominion police were closing about him a net of evidence on allegations of bigamy, narcotic selling, and false representations, Dr. Arnold Tangier, self-styled Buddhist priest, prophet, mystic and spiritualist, has fled from Winnipeg, leaving behind him hundreds of victims of what police declare to be an elaborate fraud scheme which has netted him thousands of dollars from residents of the city.

Surrounding himself with an aura of Oriental mysticism, Dr. Tangier is said in the five weeks he was in Winnipeg, to have duped many wealthy society women, among others, into paying him large sums of money for seances held in his room at the Fort Garry hotel, where, clad in flowing robes of eastern pattern, seated in a gorgeous tent, about which were hung cabalistic signs and symbols, he told unsuspecting devotees of the occult, the past and future, expatiated on psycho-analysis, all under pretence of being a Buddhist priest, while police declare he is a French-Canadian, who never was in Tibet.

In addition to private meetings in the Oriental splendor of his own apartments, Dr. Tangier, in public addresses, made startling prophecies of a great world war in 1926, in which the yellow races were to rise and overpower the white nations of the world. He was, he claimed, an agent of the Tibetan government, three of whom he said were sent into the world each year to spy out general conditions. India, he said, is to throw off British rule, in the general uprising of the east against the west.

Dr. Tangier is known to police as Prof. Tangier and Dr. Lavallee, and is said to have been convicted of a charge of selling narcotics in British Columbia. Royal-Canadian Mounted Police were investigating his actions here, on suspicion of dope peddling, but had not obtained sufficient evidence on which to issue a warrant, up to the time of his departure. In addition, he is said to be guilty of bigamy, having married a woman in Saskatchewan, it is said, while he already had a wife somewhere else in Canada. Local police cannot proceed against him on this charge, it is said, it being in the jurisdiction of another province.

The alleged faker is said by officials who were investigating his actions, to be possessed of a fascinating personality, tinged with mysticism, which led dabblers in the spiritualistic to become easy victims of his suave polished manners. He is said to have described in a picturesque manner his early life and education as a disciple of Buddha, telling his fascinated victims of the great temples and the mystic rites practiced in them. He stated he had been a priest in a Tibetan monastery, and, once he left the walls of the institution, could never return to it.

Police officials deny they will take any action to place under arrest the alleged French-Canadian impostor, who is said to have duped hundreds of people of the city and province.
