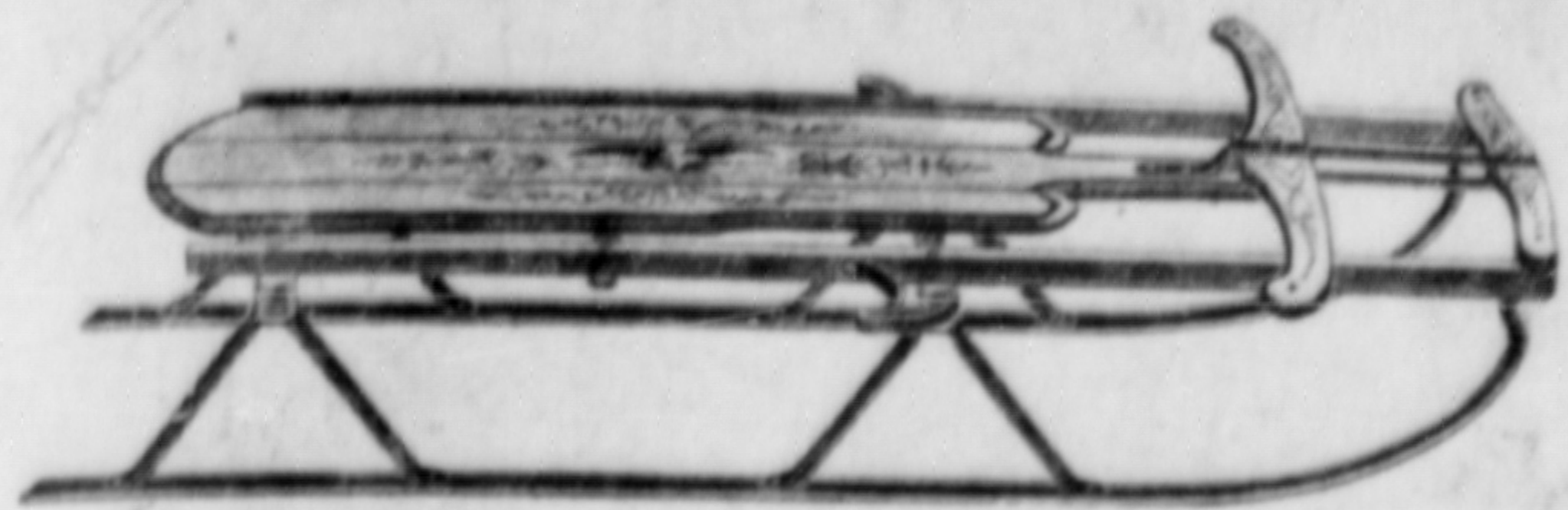

ARMISTICE DAY IS GENERALLY OBSERVED

Two Minutes of Silence Kept in Streets, Public Places and Homes

"Honor to whom honor is due," Many of Prince Rupert's bravest sons lie asleep in Flanders Fields today after paying the supreme sacrifice for their country. In the people of this city paid silent tribute to their memory at eleven o'clock this morning when in the streets, the courtroom of justice and in the homes they stood with heads bowed while the bell in the fire hall pealed out in ringing tones. The request of Aetin Mayor Dybbavn that all citizens cease activity from their daily tasks for two minutes was generally observed.

To many of those who stood with bowed heads came back the memory pictures of the gallant lads who went away smiling never to return. In the police court City Solicitor Hooper was in the midst of an argument against a person alleged to have broken the laws of the country which the soldiers fought and died for in France. All over the streets the flags were dipped in half mast for the two minutes of silence and then they floated to the breeze. Flags of many different nations were seen on Third Avenue.

The ladies of the I.O.O.F. were kept busy all day selling poppies and by afternoon had sold nearly 3,000 emblems. The chapters taking part in the sale included Adair, Carss, Hill 60, Queen Mary and the Girl Guides.

All citizens with private cars are asked to have their autos in front of the G.W.V.A. headquarters on Sunday afternoon to go to the service at the cemetery.
