The Union steamer Venture, inaugurating the new service from Vancouver to Prince Rupert and Skeena and Naas River canneries, arrived from the south last night at 10:15, with passengers, freight and mail and left again for the Naas River. The vessel is scheduled to return south this afternoon. Throughout the summer she will arrive here on Fridays from the south sailing again for Vancouver and way ports on Saturdays.

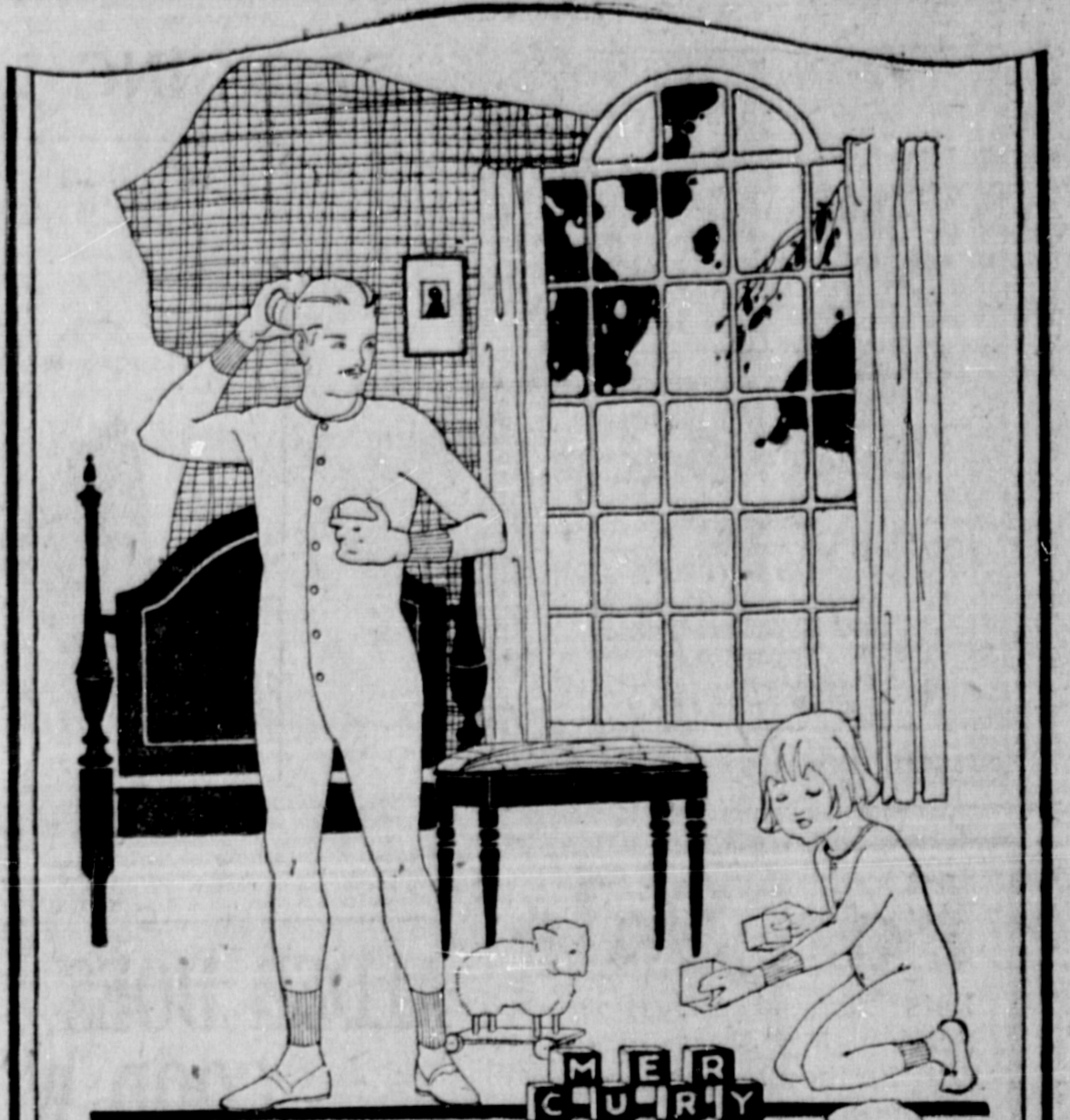
