FARMER GOVERNMENT CONTINUES POLICY LIBERALS STARTED

EDMONTON, Feb. 6.—Emphasizing the necessity for strictest economy in the conduct of affairs, the speech from the throne, delivered by the Lieutenant-governor at the opening of the first session of Alberta's fifth legislature Thursday afternoon, also forecast a continuation of the policy of development in highways, telephones and railways undertaken and carried forward by the late Liberal government in the province.

The official declaration of policy followed very closely the lines of former years in that no definite policies were announced. Further assistance will be given in the drought-stricken areas, more attention will be devoted to the marketing of farm products and educational and health work will be carried on in an energetic manner. Co-operation with other western provinces will be maintained with the object of bringing about a reduction in freight rates, and the Dominion Government will be urged to immediately transfer to the province the natural resources. The speech also made the formal announcement that a provincial department of labor would be created in the near future.

FIRE LOSSES VERY WASTEFUL DECLARE FIRE UNDERWRITERS

NEW YORK, Feb. 6.—Three hundred and thirty-four thousand dwellings at \$5000 each, sufficient to house 1,700,000 persons, could be built with the money lost in fires in the United States from 1915 to 1920, according to figures given out today by the National Board of Fire Underwriters.

The board places the national fire loss during the five-year period at \$1,672,722,677, based on an examination of over 3,000,000 reports of fires. Matches and smoking hazards are held responsible for \$90,000,-

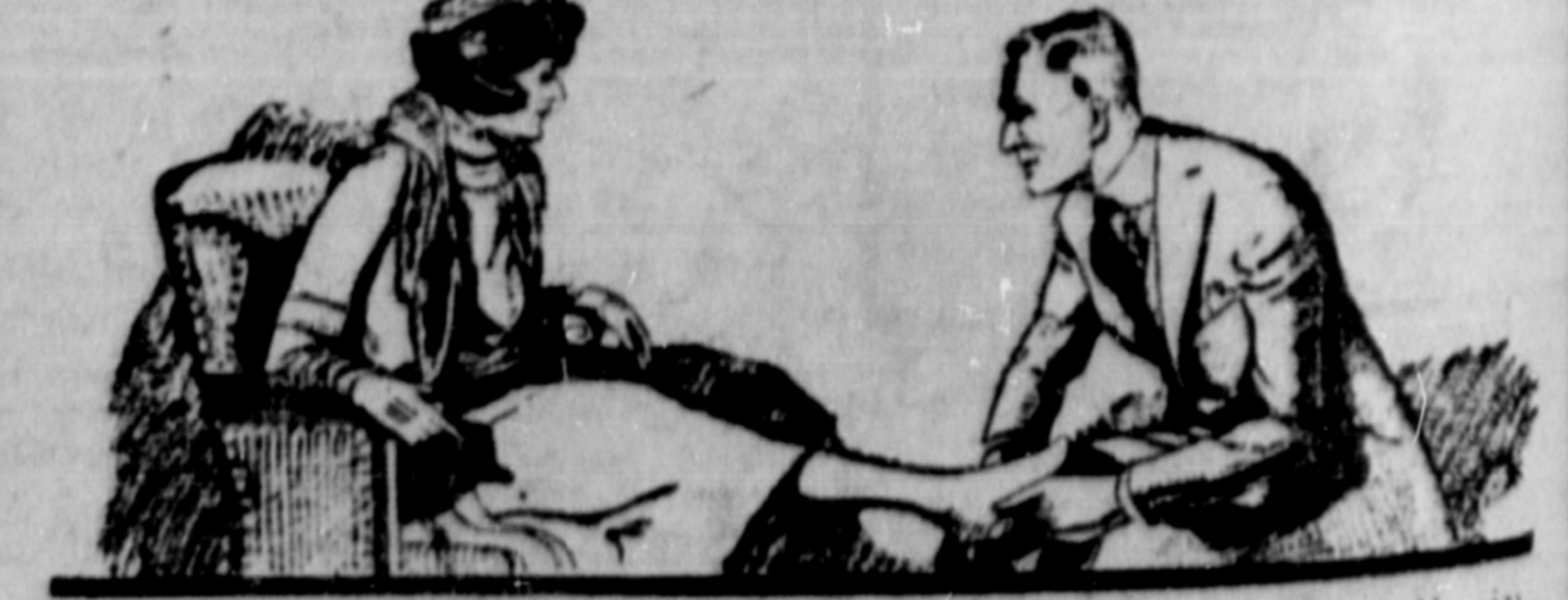
