### CANADIAN CLUB HEARS ADDRESS ON WORLD PROBLEMS AND WHY UNITY OF ACTION NECESSARY.

colored race over the white one. The effect went reverberating among the nations and awoke a race consciousness.

Indian troops had been fighting with the Allies in the late war and this was bound to alter their status in the Empire. India had been given a new constitution but still the people were not satisfied even though the new constitution had not yet been tried.

In Africa. Black troops had fought for the French against a white nation. In Africa natives had fought the battle of the white man. An African race consciousness was the result.

In the Pacific the race problem had to be faced. In Egypt and the East there was a similar problem. There was the religious aspect in northern Africa, which while unimportant at present might develop. In the United States and in South America there were race problems. All these were sources of danger. While the major possibility was not likely such as had taken place in 1914, these points were sources of irritation. He did not think, however, that the next world war, if it came, would arise from these sources.

### Wars of Revenge.

Colonel Forster spoke of the danger of wars of revenge, started by those who had suffered defeat or loss as a result of the later war. It was only to be expected that those who had lost much would try to get it back. There were nations like Germany, Hungary, Turkey, Austria and Bulgaria. The unstable condition of the smaller nations also were danger spots. The Caucasian republics which were swallowed up by Soviet Russia within two years after their formation and their disappearance had caused little attention. Finland, Lithuania, Estonia and Latvia, which cut Russia off from the Baltic, were likely to be swallowed up by their larger neighbor. It was doubtful if a big country like Russia would tolerate their existence between her and the sea. There was trouble already with Finland and it was possible that Russia was forcing a quarrel with that country.

### Polish Danger.

Poland was in a different position, especially if there should be a rapprochement between Russia and Germany, which was to be expected. Russia had everything to gain from close relations with Germany and Germany from Russia. Poland was between them.

### LARGE SUM UNCLAIMED BY WAR VETERANS

Militia Department Has 1000 Accounts With Balances Due Ex-soldiers and Dependents.

Although more than three years have elapsed since the conclusion of the great war, nearly 1,000 accounts of soldiers and their dependents in the department of militia and defence at Ottawa remain unsettled with credit balances, due principally to the lack of proper addresses to which closing out cheques could be forwarded. Over \$300,000 is involved, covering balance of pay and allowances for war services, soldiers' gratuity which was payable upon discharge from the army, separation allowance and assigned pay due to dependents of ex-servicemen, as well as dependents' portion of war service gratuity. More than half of the amount is payable to dependents.

These particulars were brought to light through a campaign undertaken recently by the Great War Veterans Association of Canada to secure final adjustment of all claims arising from war services.

Since last October this organization has succeeded in securing settlements in hundreds of cases not only in the militia department but also of pensions for hospital treatment and other matters under the jurisdiction of the department of Soldiers' Civil Re-establishment; besides claims in other governments, and matters outside government circles.

The Great War Veterans Association has decided to publish the names of all those to whom credit balances are due on the books of the militia department in the hope that the proper address may be secured and settlement effected.

Starting on February 4, the official magazine of the association will publish a fresh list of the names every week. All former soldiers have been requested to scan the lists and report the addresses of any of those they may know.

The lists will be posted in the G.W.V.A. Club Rooms and in prominent places elsewhere, and everything will be done to provide every opportunity so that the ex-soldier and dependents may be connected with the money due them.

The G. W. V. A. is undertaking this service without remuneration and asks for the general co-operation of the public in locating those whose names are listed.

All claims can be forwarded through the local secretary.
