JESSIE HAS MORE GOLD

Finest Ore Showing Yet Found Just Opened at Smithers' Property

SMITHERS, B.C., Oct. 23—Recent development work at the Jessie Gold Mine Hudson Bay Mountain, has been successful in opening up the finest ore-showing yet found on the property, either on the surface or underground. The drift tunnel which is being run on the vein has, during October, encountered a body of ore, chiefly arsenopyrite, up to six feet in width. Across the face of the tunnel at the present time it shows thirty inches wide of solid ore dipping into the mountain at an angle of thirty degrees. It has more of the auriferous arsenopyrite than the surface showings and has but little galena and zinc. The arsenical iron is in a white quartz.

The result of this development is in accordance with the expectations of the management and as predicted by the government district engineer, Douglas Lay, and the company's consulting engineer, W. G. Norrie-Loewenthal, both of whom stated that, as depth was gained, it could be reasonably anticipated that there would be more of the arsenical iron and less of the galena and zinc ores and consequently an increase in the gold values.

L. S. McGill, the company's manager, has just returned from a trip to Vancouver in connection with the company's finances and is hopeful of being able to let a contract during November for running 300 feet more of drift tunnel during the winter months. Tenders are being called for this purpose.

FINED AT BURNS LAKE

David Murray of Southbank has been fined \$10 and costs, with option of seven days' imprisonment, at Burns Lake by Stipendiary Magistrate R. W. MacGowan for operating a truck without licence plates and was mulcted an additional \$5, with three days' option, for driving without a driver's licence, according to word received at divisional headquarters of the provincial police here. The fines were paid in each case.
