Take the church page of any city newspaper on Saturday and note the many different varieties of Christianity, so many as to leave the famous "57" far in the shade. **Differences in Praying**

There is a difference in praying and repeating or saying prayers. We have committed the Lord's Prayer to memory but have not learned it by heart. It has remained in the mind but has not reached the depths whence springs real prayer.

"Prayer is the soul's sincere desire,

"Uttered or unexpressed,

"The motion of a hidden fire,

"That trembles in the breast."

What is your "soul's sincere desire?" What is your demand on life? You need not answer. Your neighbor, your pal, your fellow worker, your friends know. Your life, your character reveal your "soul's sincere desire" which is your real prayer and your religion. The condition of the world reveals that the dominion desire of man has not been the Lord's Prayer. This prayer never caused a war, nor a depression. There is in the Lord's Prayer the seed of a warless world, peace and goodwill and harmony and co-operation among the sons of men. There is in it the power that can make on this earth a quality of life like unto heaven itself.

We are looking for a way out, for a new world, a new social order, a new economic order. We can have them all by making this prayer the soul's sincere desire. Feed on this Plain Bread, never mind the pastries. Let us pray this prayer, think over the petitions, one by one. Consider the pronouns—"ours" and "us."
