## DRURY WOULD FORM A PARTY

Writes to Followers Suggesting Calling of Convention.

TORONTO, Aug. 19.—Premier E. C. Drury has apparently at least definitely decided to drop the distinctive farmer character of the political movement which placed him in power at Queen's Park, and form a third party—a Progressive party along the line of the two old parties, with town and city people taking a definite part," says the Globe.

The newspaper continues: "The first definite move toward broadening out was taken secretly by the Premier a month ago, and has only now become known. Premier Drury, it is stated, at that time, July 13th, sent to practically every U. F. O. member with one or two interesting exceptions, a communication practically suggesting the calling of a provincial Progressive convention which presumably would organize a new party and draft a new platform.

"The premier's letter to his member followers was worded in part as follows: "Suggests Convention.

"A proposal has come to me from friends of the Progressive party in the city of Toronto, and in some other cities, looking toward the calling at some time in the not too distant future of a Progressive convention for the province of Ontario.

"It is recognized the strength of the Progressive party of Ontario in the rural districts, but that there are many in the villages, towns and cities who think as we do politically, and who will be willing and eager to aid us when the time comes for a test of our strength in the province."
