GENOA, April 28 .- Plans for Russia's reconstruction are being finally determined upon today by the Genoa conference sub-commission on Russian Affairs and indications are that a definite proposition will be laid before the delegaton from Russia by the end of the week with the suggestion that the proposal be either accepted or rejected without further discussion.

It is reported that no loan will be offered to Soviet Russia but it is suggested that an international consortium may formed so that Rusia's trade, through combinations, firms and of dynamite Harold Clements individuals, may be allied with the various countries represented. This plan would be in contemplation of the economic colonization of Russia.
