EDMONTON MEN ARE NOT EAGER TO TAKE WORK ON THE FARMS

EDMONTON, April 27.—From 150 to 200 jobs on farms are offering at the government labor bureau here, but there are few accepting this work, which pays from \$35 to \$40 per month and board, and officials of the department say they will be forced to bring in labor from outside points if the local men do not take these jobs.

Further complications are expected, due to the advent of laborers from the coast, who are being routed through to Calgary via the Canadian Northern. These men will travel through Edmonton and it is very likely that a number will stop off here instead of proceeding to their destination.
