NEW YORK, Jan. 26. Canadian Press.—The Supreme Court adjourned the other day because a juror got cold feet.

It was during the recent cold snap that hit New York. During cold weather the Supreme Court room is always one of the coldest spots in the city. One of the members of the jury complained that his feet were "almost frozen." Judge Ford immediately adjourned the case in hand until either the weather man or the furnace had relented. "I've stood this thing for fifteen years and will not stand it any longer," he said. "Jurors perform services of a noteworthy character. They ought not to be forced to endanger their lives coming here."
