Third Avenue**AUSTRALIA WANTS BETTER TREATMENT ON BRITISH MARKETS**

LONDON, March 1. (By Canadian Press)—It was hard indeed for the people of the overseas Dominions to stand aside while the Mother Country fed the big foreign trusts, said Sir Joseph Cook, the new Australian High Commissioner to London, at a luncheon tendered him recently by the Australian and New Zealand luncheon clubs in London.

In the matter of trade relationship, the High Commissioner thought it was incontrovertible that the people who had poured out everything in life, including life itself, in defence of the Motherland, in the Great War should not haggle in trade bargaining in quite the same way as they would haggle in their bargaining with a neutral country which stood aside in the great cataclysmic upheaval and grew steadily richer out of their necessities and out of their agony. Australia now had her granaries full and everything was again set fair, Sir Joseph said, but they had very serious difficulties in the marketing of their products with those of other countries which were nearer to Great Britain. Was it wrong to ask the people of Great Britain to consider the difficult

G. T. P. TAXATION BYLAW IS PREPARED SUBMISSION MONDAY

The proposed new taxation agreement between the city of Prince Rupert and the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway Co. will come up formally at the meeting of the city council next Monday night, it is understood. The agreement, which provides for a considerable reduction from the present assessment, will be placed before the people in form of a bylaw and the date of the vote will probably be March 22. The council has been deliberating on the matter for several weeks in committee sessions, but the discussion has been sub rosa and reports as to what had been done have been guarded from publicity with the greatest care.

Ties which confronted them in trying to send these products to a preferable British market? Britain wanted meat, and was getting it from elsewhere. It was not the fault of Australia that she did not send her meat here. Shipping freights made it impossible to send it. That was Britain's problem.

There was a difference of 250 per cent, in the freights compared with pre-war days, and this ruled Australia out of the meat market. During the war they had sold similar meat to Britain at about a third of the price that was charged by the people who were sending it to Britain now. Now that the days of Australia's trouble had come in marketing this commodity, it was unfair to ask that Britain should consider this problem not in an entirely economic atmosphere because that was not the precise atmosphere in which they discussed family problems on the family hearthstone?
