### RIGHT OF PRISONER TO BE SEATED IN COURT

English Judge Claims That He Has No Such Right But May Be Given Privilege.

DERBY, March 20 .- The quesion whether a prisoner has a right to be seated while on trial asked that he might be allowed to be seated.

Mr. Justice Horridge,-Why? Mr. Healy-With great respect. my Lord, why not?

The Judge-Because I do not allow a prisoner to be seated! without some special reason. Mr. Healy Your Lordship! misunderstands me. I claim if as a right.

The Judge-I disallow it. Mr. Healy, asking to be allowed to argue the matter, contended

that it was a rule of law. On being invited to cite a case, he quoted from Archbold to the effeet that a prisoner should be brought into court, "without irons, shackles, or other restraint, unless there is danger of escaping," and with all consistent "humanity and gentleness, and under no other terror! of uneasiness than what proceeded from a sense of guilt."
