GREAT PICTURE FOR NEW YEAR'S

"Man from Glenarry" Coming to the Westholme Theatre on Monday and Tuesday Evenings

Heralded as the greatest Canadian moving picture yet produced, "The Man from Glenarry," is to be presented at the Westholme Theatre as the New Year's feature on Monday and Tuesday nights. Ralph Connor's book of the same name has been widely read and there is no doubt of the patronage that its picturization will be given. The book was Canadian and so is the picture. In fact, everything to do with "The Man from Glenarry" is Canadian.

The picture is a brand new release and Prince Rupert is fortunate in getting it so early in its history. It was given its first showing in Toronto on November 15 and since then has been appearing in all the leading theatres of the Dominion. This week it is showing at the Capitol in Victoria.

"The Man from Glenarry" is laid in the timber woods of the Upper Canada and in and near the city of Ottawa. The main theme of the book has been followed, but the action in Ottawa is of the present day, with embellishments of the social life of dancing at the Chateau Laurier. The scenes of the North country are of startling realism. Lumber jacks swarm in the woods and in the shanties, and most interesting and thrilling of all in the "log-hitching" contests and the driving in the sawing water. The home missionary, who is there to counteract the "original sin" of the shantymen; the camp boss and his rival of the opposing company; the bad man, Lenior, who conspires to set the forces of evil at work—all these, with a mixture of a love affair, supply a narrative that is of heart interest.

TEACHERS' EXCURSION PARTY TO VISIT HERE

Itinerary of Tour of Eastern United States Pedagogues is Out - in Prince Rupert on August 4

A large party of Eastern United States school teachers will visit Prince Rupert on August 4, next, in the course of an excursion tour of United States and Canada under the auspices of the Philadelphia Teachers' Vacation Club. The itinerary of the tour has already been issued and a copy has been forwarded to the Daily News office.

After visiting Ocean Falls, the party will arrive in the city at 10:30 on the morning of August 4. Launches will be provided for a visit to the Gold Storage plant, salmon cannery, and the native village of Melnakla. From here the party will go to Stewart and Hyder where automobiles will take them on a sightseeing tour of the salmon river valley. On the evening of August 5, the excursionists will return to the city and leave for the East, the next steps being Jasper Park and Edmonton.

The tour to be made by the teachers is one of the longest and most extensive yet attempted. It leaves Philadelphia on July 11 and will be back there on August 17. The itinerary is through the Southern States to Los Angeles, thence up the Pacific coast for 1500 miles to Prince Rupert, returning East through Canada on the lines of the Canadian National Railways.

Jack Crawford, purser of the steamer at Vancouver this trip and will take his annual holidays and Norman McLean, purser of the Prince Rupert, which is now laid up here, will relieve him temporarily. Mr. McLean went south on Thursday night.

Sport Chat

Representatives of all the principal tennis playing nations, meeting in London, recently agreed to standardize the rules of the game. The American standard of required residency in the balls was also adopted. Heretofore the governing body of no other nation has made a specific rule as to the residency but only as to size and weight. The American provision for a rest period after the third set in men's matches and after the second set in women's matches, if was decided, shall hereafter be universally followed in international contests. The various nations may, however, modify this rule for purely domestic matches. A new foot fault rule was adopted and this also is substantially the same as that effective in the United States. The unified rules agreed upon must be ratified by the individual governing bodies of the various nations.

The delegates adopted the English standard of size and weight, which varies slightly from that obtaining in the United States. The United States Lawn Tennis Association requires that the ball shall measure not less than 2 and 9/16 inches nor more than 2 and 10/16 inches in diameter and shall weigh not less than two ounces nor more than 2 and 1/16 ounces. A sub-committee has been appointed for the purpose of putting the new universal regulations into proper phraseology.

The Duke of Leinster, British sportsman, has arrived in New York to arrange with William Sutting, editor, whose challenge he accepted, the details of a trans-Atlantic race in forty-foot motor or auxiliary sail boats planned for next summer.

Discussing the proposed contest the Duke said he would rather the keetches be sailed by one man but that he had acceded to Mr. Sutting's request that two men be in each boat. The American will be accompanied by F. W. "Casey" Baldwin, the Canadian yachtman, who accompanied him when he crossed the Atlantic in the Tipsoon, a small sail boat in 1920. The Duke will be accompanied by a servant.

Notes recorded in the Great Sporting Billed in London show that racing is easily first in popularity among British sports. Over a quarter of million tickets were sold. \$50,000 has been allocated as prize money and the profits will be divided between the Grand Cross and other charitable institutions.
