Leader of Fanatical Band in South Africa Convicted of Sedition.

CLASH WITH POLICE

LONDON, Jan. 17.—(By Canadian Press)—"Enoch the Prophet," leader of the fanatical native section in South Africa known as the "Israelites," along with his two brothers, has been sentenced to six years' imprisonment with hard labor for sedition. Thirty other ringleaders have received sentences of three years' imprisonment, with hard labor, and seventy of the rank and file eighteen months' imprisonment on the same terms. In the cases of the remainder of the Israelites—old men and boys—sentence has been suspended for a year.

The Cape Town correspondent of the Times cables that the trial has justified the action taken by the police in the Bullock affair on May 24 last, when 183 followers of Enoch were shot dead in their fanatic charge upon the police. The Judge who presided at the trial on the seditionists, Sir Thomas Graham, found that no blame attached to the police, who, it is not registered under the provisions of the Act, shall be stopped and debarred from setting up any claim to or in respect of the land so sold for taxes and the Registrar shall register the name and make such tax sale as owner of the land so sold for taxes.

**UNITE BRITISH AND AMERICANS**

First Annual Meeting of British-American League Held in Victoria.

VICTORIA, Jan. 17.—Officers elected by the British-American League at its annual banquet in the Dominion Hotel were as follows: Hon. president, Lindley Grease, K.G., executive committee; Major Wendell B. Shaw, B. G. Nicholas, Joshua Kingham, P. G. Abell, Charles L. Shaw, Walter Adams, Bishop Schofield, George Bell, G. N. Maywood, Mrs. G. Spofford and Mrs. J. F. G. Hynd.

Friendship and co-operation between the British Empire and the other great branch of the Anglo-Saxon race, the United States, will be the greatest single factor in maintaining the peace of the world and preserving civilization, all speakers at the banquet agreed. Thus, they declared no more important work than that of stimulating cordial relations between the Empire and the American Republic—the purpose of the British-American League—could be undertaken.

This thought was emphasized in the annual report of President Wendell B. Shaw who stated that the league having completed its first successful year, looked forward to a future of greater usefulness. Before the meeting concluded the members expressed their appreciation of Major Shaw's unstinted efforts in founding the league and guiding its work during the last year.

Bonds of Union.

"Bonds of love hold the British Empire and the United States together much more closely and more firmly than any agreements—bonds of common percentage, common language and common ideals make certain the preservation in the world of all that is best in our civilization," Mr. Grease declared in proposing the toast to the Empire after toasts to the King and to the President of the United States had been proposed by Major Shaw and B. G. Nicholas.

"Democratic government which the British Empire and the United States have achieved today means government by the consent of the governed," observed Dr. H. E. Young, who replied to the toast. "That principle has been the basic rule of the British Empire's existence and expansion. The traditions of the past have become crystallized until now whether they become citizens of other countries or paint little patches of red in distant places on the earth's surface the growth of the Empire form the basis of government. Government forms, of course, have altered by varied conditions but those governments has reserved the great principles of freedom of speech, freedom of thought, civil and religious liberty which have grown up with the British race."
