WINNIPEG BUILDING

June Was Biggest Month of the Season in Value of Permits Issued

WINNIPEG, July 6.—With June as the biggest month of the season in building activities, the total of building work has jumped \$104,000 ahead of the first six months of 1921, an aggregate of \$1,031,800 in permits having been issued to date.

In June \$1,221,100 worth of building was authorized under permits issued by E. H. Rodgers, city building inspector, whereas May's total was \$1,106,650. In June, 1921, \$826,800 was authorized, and the total permits for the first six months of last year were \$3,084,050.

Home building, which has constituted a large part of the whole year's building, took an extra spurt in June, when permits were taken out for 144 houses above \$1,500 in value. The highest priced house to be constructed is valued at \$13,000, but several people are investing between \$9,000 and \$10,000 in new homes.

Two new schools, the Finn Exchange building and several stores have added considerably to June's building program also. The largest undertaking recorded within the last two days is construction of a church on Balswood valued at \$10,000. The church is being erected by the Greek orthodox congregation and will be located between Portage and Wolseley.

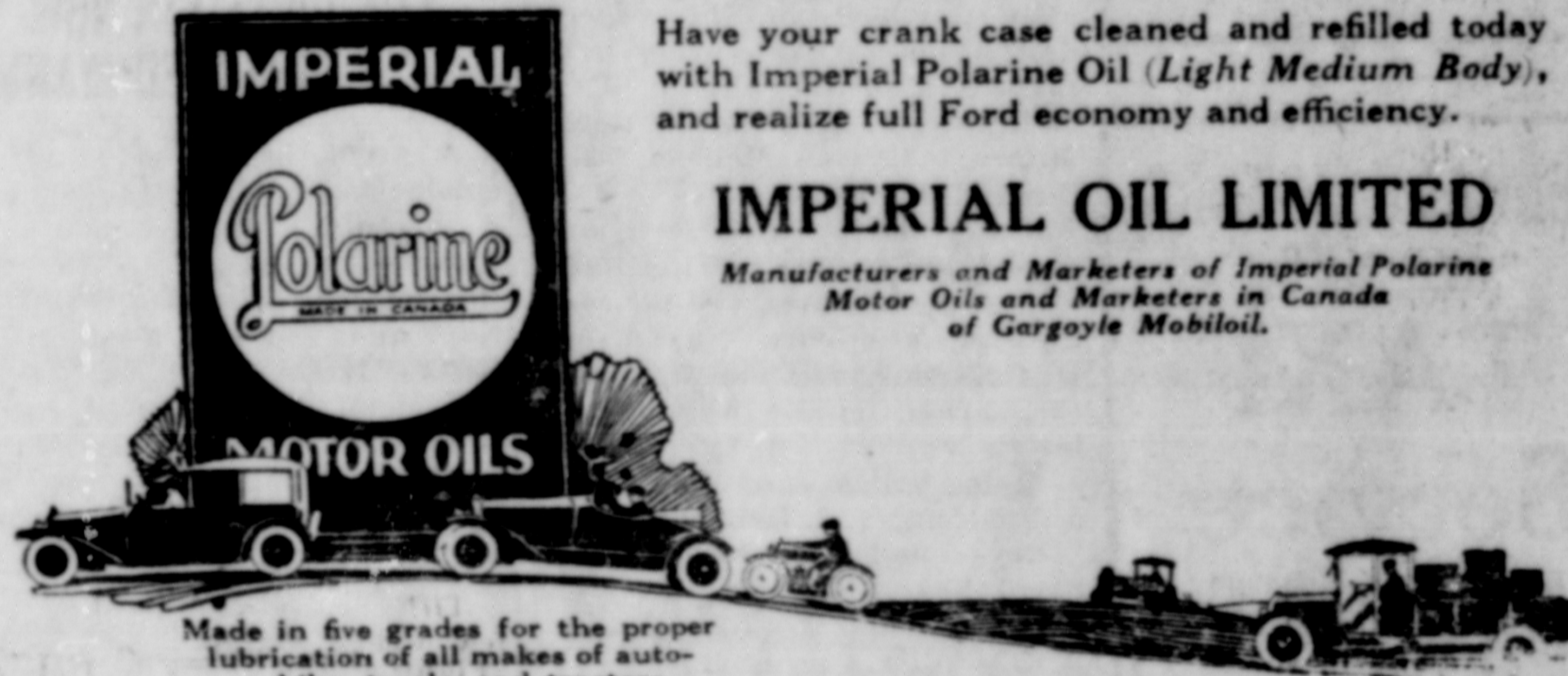
