NADEN HARBOR WHALE STATION OPENING UP

Gray and Grant on Way North and White Following Soon

The whaling tender Gray, Captain Billington, sailed from Victoria last Saturday night for Ladysmith where she will pick up a cargo of coal for Naden Harbor, Graham Island, where is located one of the big stations of the Consolidated Whaling Co. which is resuming operations this season. In her wake on Monday morning the Grant, first of the whalers, left for Naden and at the end of this week the White also sails from Victoria to join forces with the Grant.

"These vessels are being commissioned at once," said Capt. George Le Marquand, manager of the Consolidated Whaling Company, at Victoria. "The rest of the fleet will be sent to sea later, as conditions warrant. According to our present plans, we will also have only two of our stations in operation, Naden Harbor and Kyuquot. Rose Harbor, on the southern end of the Queen Charlottes, may be opened up later in the season, if it is needed. This station, and the idle whalers, are in shape to get going again at
