Mrs. Percy Carr arrived from Vancouver today on the Prince George enroute to Burns Lake to join her husband who is provincial constable at that point.

Morris Condon returned on the Prince George this morning from a business trip to Victoria and Vancouver. Mr. Condon reports that times are looking much better in Vancouver now.

Tenders for a 1300 gallon oil tank for the light department were opened by the city council last night and referred to the utilities committee for report. The bids were: Rowe's Sheet Metal Works, \$266; Atlas Boiler Works, \$402.25.

A letter from A. H. McPherson asking for the use of city pipe with which to drain lots on Eighth Avenue West on which he proposes building a \$1200 residence was referred by the city council last night to the Board of Works for report.

Miss Grant, the new librarian is expected to arrive on Saturday next. As the building occupied by the public works department will not be vacated for some weeks, the preparatory work in connection with the organization of the library will be carried out in a temporary location.

A request from the Board of Trade asking assistance from the city in sum of \$150 for the entertainment of the Montreal Board of Trade visitors when they arrive in the city on September 23 was referred last night by the council to the finance committee with power to act.

A circular letter from F. Wright, manager of the Municipal Publishing Co., Montreal, dealing with the threatened coal shortage and recommending for the city's use a Welsh coal which would cost \$10.50 per ton landed at Montreal was received by the city council last night and filed for future reference.

Mayor Rochester has received from Y. Nakano, the Japanese vice-consul, a copy of a special edition of the Japan Advertiser published on the occasion of the Prince of Wales to the "Flower Kingdom." It is a beautifully produced publication and a credit to the printing trade and journalistic taste. The Japan Advertiser is published in Tokyo by an English firm of publishers.

A report from the fire chief recommending the purchase of new solid tires for No. 1 fire truck was presented by the utilities committee to the council last night. The recommendation was adopted and the wheels will be sent to Vancouver to be fitted. The chief also reported that certain hotels and apartment houses in the city had complied with the regulations in the installation of fire escapes.

A report from the city solicitor stating that it was beyond the jurisdiction of the council to prevent Orientals from working in clubs was received and filed by the council last night. The report was called for following a resolution being presented excluding Orientals from clubs under the city's new bylaw. The city solicitor also reported that the provincial government had no power to authorize the council to pass such legislation.
