### CHOCOLATE CUP CAKES

- 1/2 cup shortening
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 3/4 cup milk
- 2 cups pastry flour (or 1 1/4 cups bread flour)
- 2 teaspoons Magic Baking Powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon soda
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 1/2 squares unsweetened chocolate
