Members of the Northern B. C. Regiment had a shoot at the Mc-Nicholl Creek range yesterday. The rifles used were short Lee-Enfields returned from service in France and the shooting was done under actual service conditions with open sights, no special sighting appliances being used. The target for the 200 yard distance was a 6 inch bulls-eye and for the 500 and 600, a twenty inch disc. These are not the standard targets which are 12 inch and 24 inch respectively. These latter will likely be up and ready by next Sunday.
