"Nuisance" or "Pet" is Question Which Agitates City Council

L. J. Marren, proprietor of the Auditorium, was in attendance at last night's meeting of the city council to lay a complaint in regard to a dog which had become a nuisance around his premises by bounding into the hall when basketball games were in progress, burrowing into the basement and otherwise conducting himself as no gentlemanly canine should do. Mr. Marren stated that he had already taken the matter up with the city solicitor who had suggested that he lay an information against the owner of the dog or devise some other means of ridding himself of the nuisance, if such it was. Mr. Marren, however, thought it advisable to appear before the council for further advice.

Junior Clavring, owner of the canine, also in attendance at the meeting, then rose to the defence of his dog which he said was no nuisance but a genuine pet. Mr. Clavring pointed out that he had given Mr. Marren permission to shoot the dog... if he could catch him. The dog was now being kept on a chain. The debate between Mr. Marren and Mr. Clavring promised to take up some time had it not been closed off by the mayor.

The city council last night adopted a recommendation from the Board of Works that the matter of raising the surface of Third Avenue as per request of G. P. Tinker so that the concrete sidewalk curbside may not be so high as at present be stood over on account of inclement weather, Ald. McCutcheon, in speaking to the report, stated that there were several other sidewalks in the same condition and the making of alterations in each case might involve considerable expenditure.

Roadway to Fish Floats Is Urged

Ald. Casey Asks City Council to Open Up Communication as Soon as Possible

Expressing the opinion that the roadway along the east side of Hays Creek could be opened out a considerable distance further towards its ultimate destination at the new fishermen's floats with a minimum of expense, Ald. G. B. Casey again urged at last night's meeting of the city council that the work be proceeded with as soon as possible. Ald. Casey thought that the council should give temporary access to the floats as soon as possible providing no very heavy work was involved.

Mayor Orme stated that the dry dock fence could be removed at any time to make way for the road. However, there would be some expenditure involved in the making of the level crossing and it would be necessary to purchase some lumber. The mayor assured Ald. Casey that the board of works would present a report on the matter as soon as possible.

S. J. Jabour was the speaker at the regular weekly luncheon of the Prince Rupert Gyro Club in the Commodore Cafe today. He gave an interesting talk on "Insurance." President William Cruickshank was in the chair and there was a good attendance of members and guests.
