TRAM SERVICE FROM VICTORIA TO SOOKE CANADIAN NATIONAL

VICTORIA, Aug. 31.—According to a letter received by Hon. F. B. Carvell, K.C., chairman of the Board of Railway Commissioners of Canada, under date of August 17, it is the definite intention of the Canadian National Railway authorities to institute a motor car service upon the island line between Victoria and Sooke Harbor in the very near future. Alastair Fraser, General Solicitor of the Canadian National Railways, states that he has received information from the vice-president that this service will be commenced in the "latter part of September, when the first car will be available for the purpose." In addition to this passenger service it is anticipated that there will be additional steam train service in operation in connection with the lumber industry and that this service will be available for the movement of freight as well.

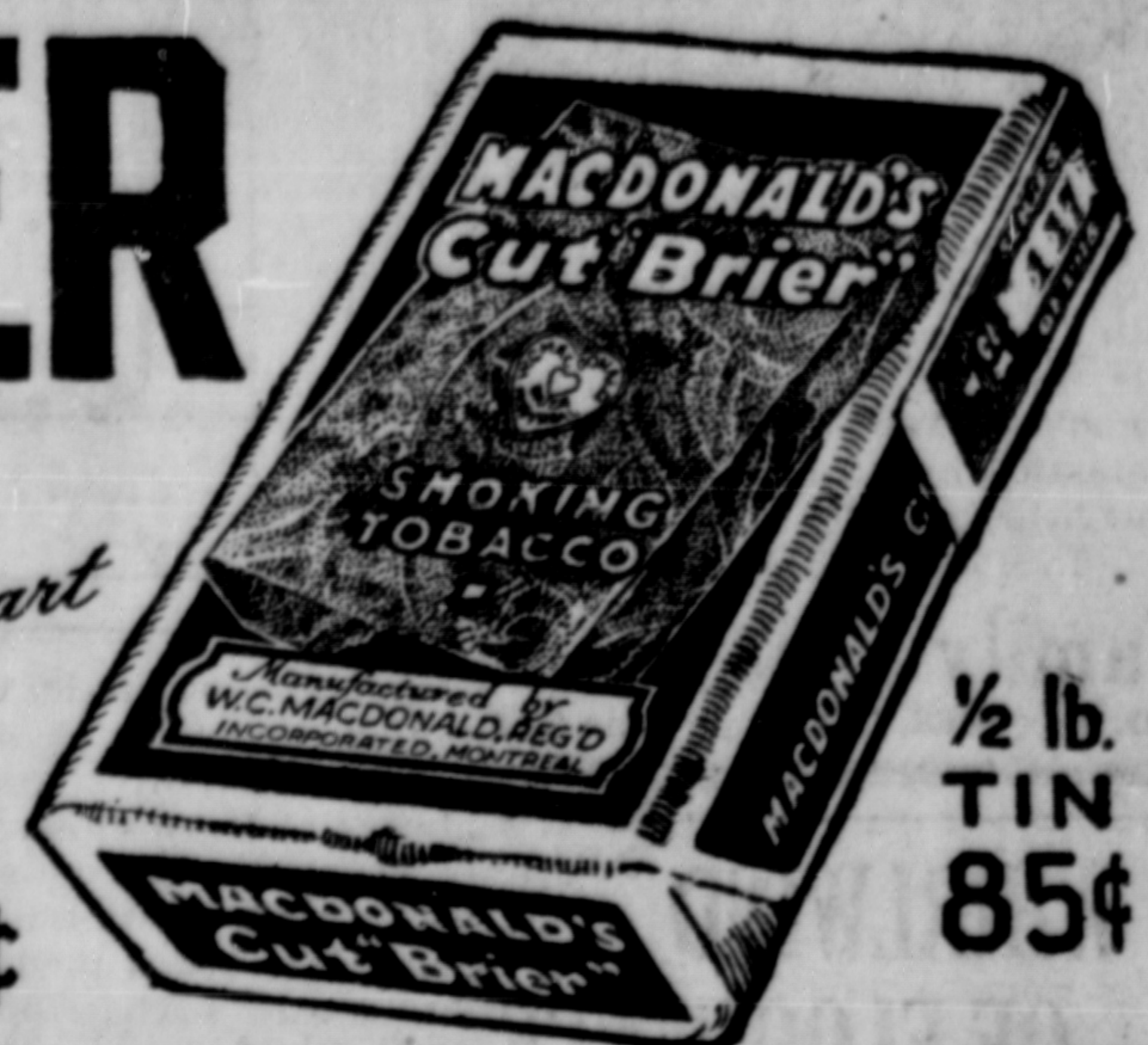
