Application to the controller of water rights of the province is to be made by the city for a reserve on Shawatlangs Lake for domestic water purposes in order to provide against the possibility of a breakdown of the Woodworth supply. A report from the city clerk recommending that this be done was adopted by the council last night. Mr. Woods also reported that, on his recent visit in Victoria, he had been successful in having the provincial government waive an account of \$726.50 for fees due for several years past on the city's reserve on Shawatlangs Lake for power purposes which had not been used and for which there seemed to be no necessity.
