LOCAL MERCHANT SAYS PRICES HIGH IN SOUTHERN CITY

People Talk Politics and Are Pleased with Appointment of Dr. King.

Martin O'Reilly, who arrived home yesterday, has been looking into business conditions in the south. He says that in spite of all their allegedly cheap sales the men's clothing establishments here are selling cheaper than they are in Vancouver. Business is good there and everyone seems cheerful and is looking for better times in the spring.

"Yes, everybody is talking politics," said Mr. O'Reilly. "I found that the appointment of Hon. Dr. King as minister of public works in the Ottawa Government is very popular as everyone looks upon Dr. King as a good safe man who will bring credit on the province."

"How about the provincial Government?" Mr. O'Reilly was asked.

"There is no need to worry over the Provincial Government," he replied. "There will not be an appeal to the people of the province for several years yet, if my sizing up of the situation is correct. In the interior there will be no difficulty in returning a minister and filling the vacancies."

"How do you account for the high prices of clothing in Vancouver?" Mr. O'Reilly was asked. "The high rents are chiefly responsible. Stores fetch an enormous price and it is impossible to remain in business unless large profits are made. That is why Prince Rupert people can get better values here than they can in Vancouver or any of the big cities."
