Freight Rates Discussion of Interest.

The discussion of the parliamentary rail rates committee at Ottawa has become of direct interest to Prince Rupert. The question affects lumber and fish shipments which represent the foreign and long distance business of this city and district. It is gratifying to know that reductions in the lumber rates are to be brought into effect although the cut now proposed may not be large enough to entirely meet the requirements here. There is a chance, however, that it may be greater than is now expected.

As far as fish is concerned there is no reduction proposed by the authorities at this time, although the B.C. Packers' Asso-L ciation has asked that the reduction be also made applicable to it. Fish, however, being a perishable commodity with the varions varieties being usually peculiar to certain districts, is not so much affected and the fishing industry cannot be entirely crippled on account of the excessive rates as has been the lumber industry in this district. Nevertheless, from a national standpoint, it is highly desirable that reductions be made here also.

An Impossible

Railway Theory. A theory has been advanced in respect to the Canadian National Railways and freight rates that in many ways might seem practicable but which in other ways would seem absolutely impossible. It is the suggestion that, where certain districts and industries suffer through high rates, the rates might be reduced and any deficit in operation caused thereby might be met by the country as a whole in appropriations that are made by the government to cover railway operation losses.

Such a theory might be a very welcome one to the Canadian Government Railways which are nationally owned but, on the other hand, it would hardly seem fair to the Canadian Pacific Railway which is privately owned and operated. It is a principle which, for that reason, will probably never come into effect for it would do nothing but put the Canadian Pacific in the same insolvent condition that the Canadian National Railways are trying to emerge from at the present time, for the Canadian Pacific would have to reduce rates to make the covering of operating costs questionable. Such a suggestion, of the face of it and in the interests of fairness would thus seem impossible.

Railway Tourist

Business Not Competitive.

It is interesting to note in advertisements which have recently appeared alongside each other in Eastern newspapers how the various railway companies work hand in hand with each other in bidding for the western tourist trade.

Just last week in the Toronto Globe advertisements were started for the Union Pacific, Canadian Pacific and Canadian National Railways western excursions. The Union Pacific advertised "Toronto to Portland, Tacoma, Seattle and return with side, trips to Yellowstone, and Rocky Mountain National Parks, \$109.55"; the Canadian Pacific "Toronto to Vancouver, Victoria Seattle or Portland and return via Banff and Yoho Park, \$109.55' The Canadian National, "Vancouver, Victoria and Seattle or A. Great Change.


