The proposed expedition of the local Elks' basketball team to Anyox for the week-end was definitely called off yesterday. There was not a sufficient number of players and fans who could get away for the time that would be required to make steamboat connections and, for the same reason, it was impossible to hire a special gasoline boat to make the trip. It is to be hoped that this will not be the last opportunity for the locals and the smaller town boys to meet and that successful arrangements for a series may be made at some later date. With steamship service such as it is now, it would seem to be more convenient for Anyox to come to Prince Rupert. A team from that town could come down on the Chelobsin on Tuesday and return the next day on the Prince Rupert, playing here on Tuesday evening.

There certainly is an unprecedented amount of interest being taken in billiards in the city this winter. With three leagues going and many less skilled players who can not qualify for the tournament games playing friendly games, all the tables in town are being kept busy most of the time. Prince Rupert possesses several very skillful senior players and many of the juniors show great promise of developing into expert players with practice.

All six teams in the Junior Billiard League have now participated in one tournament each and the games seem to be drawing equal interest to that manifested in the Senior League fixtures. With a clean sweep to their credit, the Excelsiors are leading, with the Grotto coming along a close second. The Maple Leafs are third and the St. Andrew's, Elks and Beavers come along in the order mentioned. The Intermediate League starts next Monday night. It is understood that there will be several players in this league who have already appeared on one or two occasions in the Senior, but who were unable to stand the pace there.
