LOCAL MILL MAY REOPEN

If Arrangements can be Made to Have G. G. M. M. Vessels Call at Port.

There is considerable demand at the present time from the Oriental market for spruce and hemlock lumber, and it is understood that the Prince Rupert Lumber Co., which owns the big modern mill at Seal Cove, is taking steps to get some of this business, especially for hemlock lumber. The main difficulty seems to be that of transportation of the product and to remedy this the co-operation of the Canadian Government Merchant Marine must be obtained. It is believed that if it could be arranged to have these G. G. M. M. steamers call here for lumber cargo, the local mill would reopen at once. The matter is to be taken up at an early meeting of the Board of Trade, it is understood.

MINING COMPANY IS TAKING OVER FIDDLER CREEK GOLD MINES LTD.

The Tredway Mines, Ltd., was incorporated last week for the purpose of taking over the property of the Fidler Creek Gold Mines, better known as the Louis Gnauss property. Under the re-organization it is expected extensive work will be done on the property.
