BIG CROWD OUT TO SEE MARY PICKFORD

Her Little Lord Fauntleroy Was Excellent and Pleas'd Audience Much.

The opening night for Mary Pickford in "Little Lord Fauntleroy" found the Westholme Theatre crowded to the doors and there is every expectation that it will be well filled again to-night.

In the lexicon of praise there are no words comprehensive enough to set forth the glory of this wonder play. Never in her career of superb work has Mary Pickford done anything approaching her artistry in this production.

Miss Pickford's presentation of the two characters, Dearest, the mother and Gedric Errol who later becomes Lord Fauntleroy, sets a new mark for this cinematic. Unquestionably this picture pushes the film industry ahead many leagues.

The story of "Little Lord Fauntleroy" is too well known to be repeated here. Suffice it to say that the Pickford adaptation adheres very closely to the Burnett plot, with the result that none who have read the book will take offense at the play.


